RVTD staff thanked those members for their years of service. Edem Gomez reviewed the current members of the STIFAC Committee and the needed category representation as required by STIF rules. RVTD held a solicitation in December 2023 for community members to apply to serve on STIFAC. RVTD received a lot of public interest to join the STIFAC. RVTD Staff reviewed the applicants internally and staff recommended that applicants Cara Carter, Hector Flores, Jennifer Christopherson, and Natalie Mettler be appointed to serve on the STIFAC. Applicants would represent needed categories on the committee, would replace departing members, and fill one current vacant position. 3:42pm	Edem Gomez	 Edem provided an overview of the STF Low Income Bus Pass and STIF Low Income Requirements. The STIFAC awarded \$93,540 in free bus passes to 22 eligible organizations for the 2023-25 Biennium, with the inclusion of the mini-solicitation awards at the end of the 2021-23 biennium RVTD and STIFAC was able to fund 100% of the eligible bus pass requests for the biennium. The remaining funds will be distributed either through a Mini solicitation with current awardees or may be used internally by RVTD to service low-income communities directly. A progress report was given on the distribution of fare through the Low-Income Bus Pass Program. Through September 2023 \$59,354 of free fare has been picked up by organizations. 702 individuals have received free transit fare through the 1st quarter of the biennium. 	•	2023-2025 STIF Low Income Bus Pass Program Award List

	Paige West	Route 17: Edem Gomez provided an overview of the new STIF funded service, Route 17, which began operation on June 26, 2023. The new route funded by STIF dollars was a priority project in the 2023-25 STIF Plan. The route is a circulator route that begins and ends in Ashland serving previously unserved neighborhoods in Ashland. Route 17 ridership data was presented to the group through November 2023.		Plan
		• RVTD Construction: <u>Paige West</u> provided an update on RVTD's Transportation Building Construction Project which began construction in September 2023. The project is primarily being funded by a \$12.5 million grant from the Federal Transportation Administration, local match, and a STIF Discretionary Grant. The new building is expected to be completed by the end of 2024. The building is an important project that will help meet the current and growing needs of the District to provide transit services to the community over the next 20 years. The project also includes a parking structure that will help open up RVTD's campus to park additional buses and vehicles and provide enough space for growing bus operator staff in the coming decades. RVTD is also beginning work on a new Administration Building that will be housed across from Front Street Station in a		

building purchased from Rogue Community College in 2021. That building remodel project is expected to be completed by Summer of 2024. The project is also being funded by Federal and State grants. Both projects are in coordination with RVTD's Campus Master Plan.

RVTD STIF Budget Adjustment: Paige West shared an update to the STIF 2023-25 budget, the proposed Central Point Service Project, and the service frequency increase projects to the Route 40 and Route 60 in the STIF Plan. After research through community and passenger surveying a more robust Central Point service will provide better transit outcomes. After consultation with RVTD staff and ODOT Staff, RVTD is planning on shifting funds from the frequency increase projects on the Route 60 and contingency funds into the Central Point Service project and modification of the Route 40. This shift will provide more funds to build a better Central Point Service rather than just an increase to service frequency on existing routes. Amber Roble Myre: Asked if the new service would be an express route in Central Point to connect them to the route serving Medford. Paige West: Clarified that a final service plan has not been completed and staff is still working on the conceptual route planning for the new service. Information from the passenger surveys has been useful in informing how best to plan the new service. Survey indicated that 70% of Medford residents using the Route 40 were staying in Medford and not traveling to Central Point. The budget shift within the plan is compliant with STIF but needs to be reviewed by the STIFAC. Emile Amarotico: Is this essentially a reallocation of funds to another approved project? Paige West: It is a shift of funds between projects of the approved STIF Plan as per STIF rules. Amber Robles Myre: Do we need to formally approve this now or is this laying groundwork for a final recommendation later. Paige West: When we get closer to a route alignment, we will present back to the STIFAC. We wanted to inform the STIFAC on potential changes and updates to the service project. Maybe later this summer. We may also discuss the transportation building project. RVTD planning staff will continue to work on a conceptual plan for the Central Point service.

		Final Meeting for STIFAC Members: RVTD Staff and STIFAC members thanked Amber, Kristin, and Brad for their years of service on STIFAC. This will be their last STIFAC Meeting.

RVTD began operating a new circulator within the City of Ashland in 2023 with extremely limited service. The Route 17- Ashland Circulator currently only operates weekdays between 9:00am to 4:00pm on an hourly basis. RVTD's other

routes generally operate between 6:00am to 8:00pm weekdays and 7:00am-6:00pm on Saturdays. RVTD would use funding to expand service to be consistent with other route's service times and improve service to 30 min. frequency. Vehicles are available to implement this service and drivers are continually being recruited.

Enhancing service in Ashland has been a priority since the original 2019 STIF Plan but it came after 5 other projects. Finally, in 2023 RVTD had the opportunity to begin this STIFfunded project however due to rises in the cost-of-service RVTD lacked the funds to implement the route as originally planned. The City of Ashland supports this project and looks forward to improved service.

The funding request is exclusive to the additional hours of service and frequency during the 2025-2027 biennium. RVTD currently contributes \$312,000 annually toward the Ashland service. The total annual cost for the route with the proposed expansion is \$1,021,000 bringing the funding request to approximately \$700,000 each year or \$1.4 M for the biennium. RVTD does not have the ability to include this expansion in the biennium STIF Formula Plan as the amount of funds we anticipate will not be enough to maintain STIFfunded projects already in service.
